EDINBURGH

- Edinburgh is Scotland's Capital City, One of the Most Historic Cities in the United
- Scottish Whisky also known as 'Scotch'. It's believed whisky-making began in Scotland as winemaking methods spread from monasteries in Europe; with no access to grapes, monks used grain mash instead to produce an early form of the popular spirit. The name itself derives from the Gaelic name, uisge beatha, which translates loosely to 'water of life'. There are five Scottish whisky regions, Campbeltown, Highland, Islay, Lowland and Speyside, each with their own distinct flavours.
- Edinburgh Castle is a historic castle in Edinburgh, situated at the top of the Royal Mile on top of Castle Rock, all elites can be seen from the city center and you can overlook the whole city of Edinburgh from above. The regal Crown Square is a real highlight, where you will find the magnificent Scotland's Crown-famous Stone of Destiny. The city of Edinburgh's coat of arms features is the image of Edinburgh Castle. The annual Edinburgh Military Exercise is also held in front of Edinburgh Castle.
- Royal Mile Old Town is Edinburgh's most famous street. It connects Edinburgh Castle (to the west) with the Palace of Holyroodhouse (to the east). There are also many characteristic shops on this street, selling some local specialties of Scotland, and there are usually many street artists wearing kilts playing bagpipes on the roadside.
- Palace of Holyroodhouse is the official residence of the British monarch in Scotland. Queen Elizabeth II spends one week in residence at Holyroodhouse during summer, where she carries out a range of official engagements and ceremonies.

STIRLING

- **Urquhart Castle** Near Inverness in the Highlands in the north of Scotland. Standing in a beautiful location on the shore of Loch Ness, Urguhart Castle consists of a 13th-century castle of enclosure with a curtain wall and gatehouse. The courtyard encloses ranges of buildings, including a hall and chapel, and has a 16th-century tower house at one end. There are fine views up and down Loch Ness.
- Fort Augustus is a small village on the most southern tip of Loch Ness. A picturesque place where you can watch Loch Ness with places to eat and drink, shopping and history.

GLASGOW

- Glasgow is Scotland's biggest city, also known as the second city of the British Empire. Glasgow famous around the UK as a great shopping destination, over 2,000 bars and restaurants serving mouth-watering food!
- Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum One of Scotland's most popular free attractions and features 22 themed, state-of-the-art galleries displaying an astonishing 8000 objects. The most famous painting on display at Kelvingrove is the Salvador Dali masterpiece 'Christ of St John of the Cross'.

MANCHESTER

Manchester Town Hall - in Albert Square is one of the most iconic landmarks in the city. One of the finest examples of Neo-Gothic architecture in the United Kingdom, the exterior is dominated by the clock tower which rises to 280 feet and houses Great Abel the clock bell. The town hall was designated as a Grade One listed buildings in England.

MANCHESTER

- John Rylands Library is a late-Victorian neo-Gothic building on Deansgate in Manchester, England. It is part of the University of Manchester. The library, which opened to the public in 1900, was founded by Enriqueta Augustina Rylands in memory of her husband, John Rylands. This world class collection includes the oldest known piece of the New Testament, the St John Fragment.
- Old Trafford Nicknamed "The Theatre of Dreams". One of the most famous football stadiums in the world, with the capacity 74,310, it is one of the five-star football stadiums of UEFA. Manchester United have used this stadium as their home ground since 1910.

STONEHENGE

Stonehenge & Avebury Heritage Site - The World Heritage Site is made up of two landscapes: Stonehenge in the south of Wiltshire and Avebury in the north Swindon. At the Stonehenge Visitor Centre and the Alexander Keiller Museum in Avebury, you can find out about the development of the World Heritage landscape and its monuments over a period of around 2000 years from the early Neolithic period through to the Bronze Age. At Stonehenge these include the massive henge at Durrington Walls, Woodhenge and the densest concentration of burial mounds in Britain.

LONDON

- **Buckingham Palace** is a London royal residence and the administrative headquarters of the monarch of the United Kingdom. Located in the City of Westminster, the palace is often at the centre of state occasions and royal hospitality. The palace has 775 rooms, and the garden is the largest private garden in London.
- Windsor Castle Built in the 11th century by William the Conqueror, this sprawling grand home covers an area of 13 acres. Home to royalty, is one of the official residences of His Majesty The King. Visit the magnificent State Apartments furnished with some of the finest works of art from the Royal Collection. The famous Queen Mary's Dolls' House where you can peek inside the rooms filled with tiny toys. The St George's Chapel, a 500-year-old medieval marvel, where Prince Harry and Meghan Markle married in 2018 and where Queen Elizabeth II was laid to rest in 2022. Take in the splendour of St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, one of the finest examples of Gothic architecture in England. *Schedule for all attractions may change, refer to Royal Collection Trust website for latest update
- Big Ben is located was originally the Clock Tower, but it was renamed Elizabeth Tower in 2012 to mark the Diamond Jubilee of Elizabeth II. Its clock was the largest and most accurate four-faced striking and chiming clock in the world. The clock tower has been part of a Grade I listed building since 1970.
